

Locating Comics and Graphic Novels in the WSU Libraries (Lorena O'English 9/10/2019)

Where comics/GNs are located:

- 2nd floor Owen Science Library – K-12 collection (fiction and non-fiction)
- Owen Science Library and Holland and Terrell Libraries
 - Many comics, comic collections, and graphic novels are located around the PN 6700 (Library of Congress Classification)
 - Others (mostly nonfiction) are located in the disciplinary subject areas that they fit, for example *Maus: A Survivor's Tale* by Art Spiegelman is located at D810 .J4 S643 1986 which falls into the classification for World War II (D731-D838)
- Manuscripts, Archives & Special Collections (MASC, Terrell Library) has a collection of comics including many alternative, underground, and mini-comics. Not all are cataloged in Search It, but many are.
